SIR WILLIAM RAE of St Catherine's, Baronet, advocate, Commissioner appointed by an act of Parliament, passed in the year 1815 (cap. 55. local and personal), to divide and allot the Common of the Lomonds of Falkland, having resumed consideration of the determination of the 7th day of May last, ascertaining the extent of the claimants' interests, and of the notices, orders, and interlocutors since,—and having at different times laid the proposed plan of division before the parties interested, and heard them thereon, and made the subdivision reserved by the determination of the 7th day of May,—and having also considered the objections which were made to the plan since the same was ordered to be deposited in the office of the Sheriff-Clerk of Fife, on the 24th day of October last, by George Johnstone of Conland, and Robert Drysdale, for himself, and certain other claimants, to whom one undivided allotment had, by their own desire, been proposed to be allocated,—as also the objections for Walter Forsyth, William Roy, Catharine Lawson, Andrew Taylor, James Birrel, and the feuars of Strathmiglo and Stedmoreland,—and in general having considered the acts of Parliament under which this division is made, and the procedure from the beginning had therein, and being with the whole well and ripely advised, finds and determines as follows.

In the first place, he sets apart the limestone-quarry, called the East Law, with ten acres immediately around the same, as measured and staked off on the plan by the letters A. B. C. D. E. F. G. H. K. L. M. N., and on the ground by twelve stones, each having W. R. 1818, upon the top; and which ten acres also comprehend a space of ground three yards wide and one hundred and sixty yards in length, running in an easterly direction from the point G. to another point U. on the said plan, and which space is also marked on the ground with march-stones, having W. R. 1818, thereupon: The limestone-quarries, called Wilkie's Quarries, with ten acres immediately around the same, as measured and staked off on the plan by the letters O. P. Q. R., and on the ground by four stones, each having W. R. 1818, marked thereon; and a quarry in the seam of limestone in which the Long Craig Quarries were wrought, with ten acres immediately around the same, stretching from the Forther Burn on the east to Craigengaw on the west, as measured and staked off on the plan by S. T. V. W., and on the ground by stones marked W. R. 1818. And he finds the persons mentioned in the determination of 7th May, and their successors, claiming under or in virtue of their rights,—viz. the Magistrates and

and Town-Council of Falkland, in respect of their Town-Hall and other public buildings, George Laurie of Lappie, and all the persons after named and designed, among whom the said Common is divided, as herein-after mentioned; excepting James Halkerston and his feuars, William Roy and his feuars, the feuars of George Kay, William Inglis and David Beveridge, James Marshall, James Henderson, David and George Swans, Janet Lumsden, William Scott, David Ness, and Mr Miller of Purin, so far as respects his lands of Fruchie and Fruchie Mill; Captain James Jameson, so far as respects his parts of Newton of Falkland and Fruchie; Mr Miller of Ballingall, so far as respects his parts of Newton of Falkland and Fruchie; Mr Skene, so far as respects Gospetrie and Strathmiglo, and the feuars of Stedmoreland,—shall, in all time coming, enjoy their right to dig, win, burn, or carry away limestone, and also the freestone within the foresaid thirty acres, as fully and freely as they have heretofore enjoyed or were entitled to enjoy the same; provided always that they shall exercise the same for the proper use of the estate only, in virtue of which, they are found entitled to such right; and that they shall not be at liberty to sell or dispose of the said limestone in any other shape or way whatever.

In the second place, the Commissioner sets apart the following roads and courses,—first, a line of road of twenty feet wide, commencing upon the Common at the end of a loan leading through the lands of Purin at the top of Purin Den, from the public highway from the New Inn to Falkland, and carried westward through the Common by the south side of the East Law to the before-mentioned limestone-quarry of 'East Law'; then still westward, crossing the high-road through the hill from Falkland to Leslie, till it reaches Wilkie's Quarries, and which line is measured and staked off on the plan by the letter r, and on the ground by march-stones marked W. R. 1818. 2. A line of road, twenty feet wide, from Mr Johnston of Lathrisk's loan, betwixt Kilgourieknow and Purin across the Common, till it joins road No i; and which line is measured and staked off on the plan and marked with the letter m, and on the ground by march-stones marked W. R. 1818. 3. A line of road, twenty feet wide, branching off from road No i, where this last turns to the south-west in allotment 64 westward till it joins allotment 65, measured and staked off upon the plan and marked with the letter s, and upon the ground with march-stones marked W. R. 1818. 4. A line of road, twenty feet wide, from Wilkie's Quarries north-westward, till it joins the ravine on the brow of the hill at the Hoglairs, from thence a line of like

like width for a harl road to the foot of the hill, then a line of road of like width leading through the allotments set apart to Thomas and John Irelands, Richard Storrar, and Laceston, and then leading nearly north-west betwixt the allotments for Laceston and Gospetrie, till it joins Lappie property, and which lines are measured and staked off on the plan and *all* marked with the letter *q*, and on the ground by march-stones marked W. R. 1818. 5. A course of thirty feet in width, from the Long Craig Quarries in a ravine to the north, till it joins a road of thirty feet wide at the foot of the hill, which road leads north till it joins a road now used at the north-east extremity of allotment 80, and which course and first-mentioned road is measured and staked off on the plan and marked with the letter *p*, and on the ground by march-stones marked W. R. 1818; and which roads and courses shall be enjoyed, in all time coming, by the persons having right, as aforesaid, to limestone, for rolling down, driving off, and conveying away the same, and also for access to such of the allotments of the Commonty after specified, as bound with the said roads respectively. 6. A line of road twenty feet wide, leading from the Falkland and Leslie Road on the east of General Moncrieff's allotment, dividing *that* from allotment 2, then east, dividing allotment 1 from 2, marked with the letter *z* upon the plan, and upon the ground by march-stones marked W. R. 1818. 7. A line of road twenty feet wide, from said Falkland and Leslie Road leading south, having the Bamblae feuars' allotment on the west, and Cashmill allotment on the east; then still leading south, having allotment 6 on the west, and 7 on the east; then leading east till it reaches allotment 14, dividing allotments 8, 10, and 13, on the south, from 7, 9, 11, and 12, on the north; as measured and staked off, and marked on the plan by the letter *y*, and upon the ground by march-stones, W. R. 1818. 8. A line of road twenty feet wide, leading from road No vii, at the south-west point of Cashmill allotment, eastward till it joins the next mentioned road No ix, and separating Cashmill and Nuthill allotments on the north, from allotments 7, 9, 11, 12, 15, and 16, on the south, as measured and staked off, and marked on the plan with the letter *x*, and upon the ground by march-stones, W. R. 1818. 9. A line of road twenty feet wide, leading from the said Falkland and Leslie Road south, dividing Nuthill allotment, and allotments 16 and part of 17 on the west, from allotments 18, 20, and 23, on the east; then leading east the length of allotment 29, and separating allotments 24 and 27 from allotments 23, 25, 26, and 28; as measured and staked off,

having allotments 75 *a*, and 83 on the east, and allotment 82 on the west; which road is marked on the plan with the letter *o*. 16. A road twenty feet wide, leading from road *r* at the south-east corner of allotment 66, running in a straight line, in a south-west direction, till it reaches the lands of Hangingmyre, at the letter *f* on the plan; and which road is marked on the plan with the letter *k*, and upon the ground with march-stones W. R. 1818. 17. A line of road twenty feet wide, leading from Hangingmyre to Easter Conland, along the boundary of the Common, from the letter *p* to the letter *o*; and which road is marked on the plan with the letter *h*. And the said twelve last-mentioned lines of road shall be used and enjoyed in all time coming by the persons having right to the allotments bounded and connected therewith, and their successors, for access to the same: And it is hereby declared, that the seventeen lines of road above specified and described shall be the only roads, spaces for roads, courses, or ways, hereafter to be used upon the said common; and the allotments of ground to be herein-after set apart shall be enjoyed by the persons entitled to the same, free of all servitudes of any other road, course, or way whatsoever.

In the third place, the Commissioner *divides, allots, and awards* the whole remaining part of the Common among the persons after-named and designed in the allotments, and according to the measurement and value severally after expressed; commencing with allotment marked on the plan 1, and situate at a short distance towards the south of the point where the public road leading from Falkland to Leslie comes first to be bounded on both sides by the Common, after leaving the lands of Nuthill, and proceeding from thence eastwards, and afterwards towards the west, according to the numbers appearing on the plan, and conform to the following schedule: The *first* column of which specifies the number of each allotment, as marked on the plan; the *second*, the person or persons to whom such allotment is allocated; the *third*, the extent of valued rent, as fixed by the determination of 7th May; the *fourth*, the real rent of the allotment, as fixed by the valuator; the *fifth*, the measurement; the *sixth*, the rate per acre; the *seventh*, the boundaries of the allotment,—viz.

Which several allotments are delineated on the plan of the said Community, by numbers, letters, and lines; and upon the ground they are marked and divided by lines of roads, or by stones having the letters W. R. and the year 1818 marked thereon: And it is hereby declared, that the several persons aforesaid, and their heirs and successors, shall hereafter enjoy the said allotments, respectively, free from any kind of servitude or restriction whatsoever. And seeing the valuator, in valuing these allotments in which the foresaid quarries and acres around them are situated, has proceeded on the footing of the proprietors of such allotments being entitled, in the mean time, to the full use of the surface of the said acres and quarries so set apart for pasture or otherwise, it is hereby declared, that these persons shall enjoy said use; but this always in such way as not to impede or injure the due exercise of the right of taking lime and freestone, provided as aforesaid.

Lastly, in respect the whole charges of carrying the said act of Parliament into execution cannot be ascertained until this award is deposited in the General Register-House, and with the Clerk of the Peace, and examined and balanced by the Sheriff-Depute of Fife, the Commissioner reserves full power to himself to ascertain and fix the amount of such charges, and of those of obtaining the act of Parliament, and of apportioning and assessing for the same, according to the respective interests of those entitled to shares of the Common, and of enforcing payment thereof,—all in terms of the act of Parliament. And the Commissioner orders and directs, that the said plan and this award be immediately deposited in the General Register-House, at Edinburgh, for preservation; and a duplicate thereof be deposited with the Clerk of the Peace of the said County of Fife; and that notice of the award and plan being so made and deposited, be given in the newspapers, and on the church-doors of the parishes of Falkland and Strathmiglo.
